



Hygge Handspun Candle Holder

Here's a quick and easy way to add a little [hygge](#) to your home decor this Winter using little leftover bits of handspun yarn that you have in your stash. Put it to good use with this wrapped candle holder that you can make in less than 20 minutes!

What you need:

Handspun yarn - 30-50 yards depending on the size of your candle holder

Note: Use a 100% wool or animal fiber yarn. Though this will not come in contact with a direct flame, the yarn will warm up along with the candle holder. Other fiber types risk burning or melting. If you use an electric candle, you could use any yarn as your wrap.

Glass candle holder - I like to use reclaimed glass candle holders from large candles.



To start, create a loop of yarn with the tail end on the left and the working yarn on the right



Start wrapping the working yarn around the candle holder making sure you capture the loop. Don't wrap too tightly, as you will need to pull the loop through the wrapping. Tip: Take a clip or piece of tape and clip or tape the loop to the top of the candle holder.



Continue wrapping the candle holder until you reach the desired amount of wrapping. Cut a long tail, thread it through the loop.



Keeping tension on the long tail, pull the loop tail until it pulls the long tail into the wrapping about halfway.



Trim the ends, place a candle in the holder and enjoy!
